In a resolution adopted in February 1977, the United Nations Commission on Human Rights first recognized the right to development as a human right. As a result, the committee decided to pay attention to the challenges on the way to the full realization of economic, social and cultural rights, especially in developing countries, and to pay special attention to national and international measures to ensure their enjoyment of those right.

"The right to the development is an in Arabian human rights by virtue of which every human person and all people are

entitled to participate in continue to an enjoy economics social cultural and political development in which all human rights and fundamental freedoms can be fully realised".

Therefore, all people should be included in and fully consulted in any development that impacts them since they are all beneficiaries of the right to development. It is the responsibility of the state to guarantee that everyone has equitable and sufficient access to resources that are necessary, and it is the responsibility of the global community to support effective international cooperation and development policies.

Article 1

Article 2

Article 3

1. States are primarily responsible for establishing the domestic and global frameworks necessary for the realisation of the right to development.
2. Full adherence to the principles of international law that promote cordial ties and cooperation among nations in line with the UN's mission is necessary for the realisation of the right to development.
3. States have a responsibility to work together to remove barriers to development and inspire it. States should recognise their rights and carry out their obligations in a way that encourages the observation and realisation of human rights as well as a new international economic order based on savages in equality entered into virtual interest and corporation dependence among all states.

Article 4

1. In order to facilitate the full realization of the right to development, States are responsible for taking measures individually and collectively to design international development strategies.
2. To encourage the more rapid growth of developing nations, sustained intervention is needed. Effective international corporations are crucial in providing developing nations with the tools and resources they need to accelerate their overall development.

Article 5

Article 6

1. All States should cooperate to promote and deepen respect for and observance of all fundamental freedoms and human rights without making any distinctions based on race, sex, language or religion.
2. The implementation, improvement and safety of civil, political, economic, social and cultural rights must accept same interest and urgency due to the fact all human rights and essential freedoms are person and context dependent.

Article 7

Article 8

1. States should implement all necessary policies at the national level to realize the right to development and ensure, inter alia, equality of opportunity for all citizens in terms of access to basic resources such as housing, employment and education. To end all social inequities, appropriate economic and social reforms must be implemented.
2. As a crucial component of growth and the full implementation of all human rights, states should promote public engagement in all areas.

Article 9

All factors of the proper to improvement set out on this announcement are indivisible and interdependent and their age must be taken into consideration withinside the context of the whole.

Article 10

A number of measures should be taken at the national and international levels, including the formulation, adoption and implementation of policy, legislative and other measures, to ensure the full application and progressive promotion of the right to development.
